ECO EXPO ASIA 2024

BEC has stepped up once again as a supporting organisation for Eco Expo Asia organised by Hong Kong Trade Development Council and Messe Frankfurt (HK) Ltd. During the 2024 edition from 30 October to 2 November, BEC set up a booth to introduce our vision, mission, as well as three environmental focus areas to the visitors, while arranging guided tours around the expo for industry experts.

Additionally, we co-organised Eco Asia Conference on 1 November, focusing on “360° Embracing Circular Economy”. Through keynote presentations and a panel discussion, pressing issues such as reducing food waste and designing sustainable products were addressed. Industry experts were invited to explore effective food waste management and eco-designs that help promote the transition to a circular economy for businesses.





On 2 November, BEC also organised “Dialogue with Secretary for Environment and Ecology”, where 400 secondary and primary school students had the opportunity to engage directly with Mr Tse Chin-wan, BBS, JP, Secretary for Environment and Ecology of the HKSAR. This interactive session was an eye-opening experience for the students, featuring lively games and discussions that provided them with in-depth insights into the Government’s environmental policies.

Simon said, “Being the most feasible solution currently available for adoption on a commercial scale, SAF will play a critical role in decarbonising emissions from aviation, while maintaining Hong Kong’s competitive edge as a regional and global hub. BEC’s participation in this programme signals our commitment to reducing emissions and working towards a green, liveable and sustainable Hong Kong.”

BEC will continue to work with different stakeholders to accelerate aviation decarbonisation. One of the flagship initiatives of BEC on aviation decarbonisation is the Hong Kong Sustainable Aviation Fuel Coalition programme.

BEC is proud to participate in the Second International Conference on Green Aviation organised by the International Association of Green Aviation in Chengdu, China. BEC Head – Policy & Research Mr Merlin Lao and Assistant Manager – Policy & Research Mr Clement Cheung attended the conference, representing Hong Kong Sustainable Aviation Fuel Coalition (“HKSAFC”) programme under BEC.



At the conference, Merlin contributed insights at the Sustainable Aviation Fuel (“SAF”) Forum, highlighting HKSAFC’s research and policy advocacy efforts, as well as the latest developments of SAF initiatives in Hong Kong. We were delighted to see other companies and organisations, including BEC Members Cathay Pacific and Airport Authority Hong Kong, share their perspectives on advancing sustainable aviation. This conference also provided a valuable opportunity for BEC to engage with key SAF stakeholders in mainland China. We believe that building strategic partnerships is crucial for the successful uplift of SAF in Hong Kong, particularly with mainland authorities and stakeholders.


As we move forward, BEC remains committed to working with our partners under HKSAFC and strengthening these international and regional collaborations to advance our research and policy advocacy for SAF development in Hong Kong. We encourage stakeholders in the aviation and energy sectors to join us in this critical dialogue.

BEC Net-zero Carbon Charter: Planning for Corporate Climate Transition


BEC held the “BEC Net-zero Carbon Charter: Planning for Corporate Climate Transition” event on 6 November, gathering over 90 representatives from various sectors to welcome new signatories and foster knowledge sharing. Professor Jing Wu from CUHK Business School shed light on the significance of Scope 3 emissions and the crucial role that supply chains play in addressing climate change. Ms Kit Fong Law from CLP Holdings presented practical strategies for integrating transition planning into business operations, setting science-based decarbonisation targets, and using scenario analysis to evaluate climate-related risks and opportunities.



The lively discussions highlighted the critical importance of collaboration in advancing sustainability and achieving net-zero targets. BEC shall remain committed to mobilising businesses and organisations towards Hong Kong’s long-term decarbonisation through our Net-zero Carbon Charter.

Chinachem Group Sustainability Conference 2024



Co-organised by BEC and Hong Kong Green Building Council, the Chinachem Group Sustainability Conference 2024 held on 7 November was a tremendous success, with over 5,000 participants joining online and offline. We were honoured to have Mr David Lam, Under Secretary for Development; Mr Joseph Chan, Acting Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury; and Mr Wong Chuen-fai, Commissioner for Climate Change, share valuable insights into the Government's climate blueprint.

With the theme "Integrating Sustainability Solutions towards a Resilient Future", the Conference brought together 27 expert speakers from various sectors, including government, business, and academia. Through dynamic keynote speeches, group discussions, and interactive Q&A sessions, the speakers touched on and explored critical topics such as climate change, sustainable financing, and impact investment. The Conference provided an excellent opportunity for like-minded professionals to connect and explore strategies to elevate sustainability initiatives.

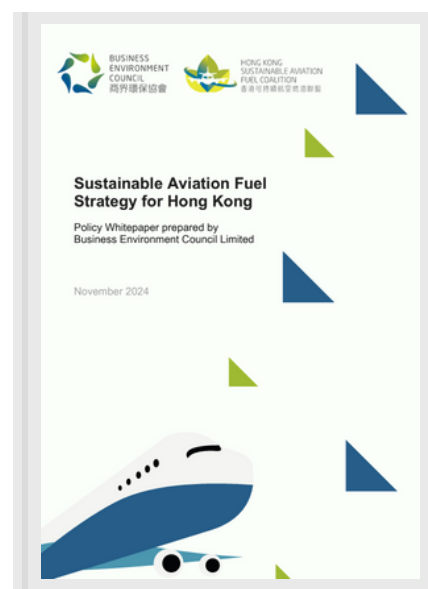

BEC Policy Whitepaper on Sustainable Aviation Fuel ("SAF") Strategy for Hong Kong is now released. Taking in the perspectives of multi-stakeholders across the SAF value chain, the document outlines critical recommendations on the roadmap and solutions for the transition to upscale the development of SAF in Hong Kong. In developing the paper, BEC conducted comprehensive market research to analyse the current global SAF landscape and policy developments. Pain points for SAF adoption in Hong Kong are identified and recommendations are set out to align the socio-economic interests of both policymakers and the industry.

ESG CORNER

The Push for Financial Disclosures from ESG Perspective

In recent years, there has been a significant global shift towards greater transparency in corporate reporting, particularly regarding ESG factors. Countries and international organisations are advocating for financial disclosures that encompass ESG metrics, recognising their importance in assessing the long-term viability of companies. This movement is not only reshaping corporate practices but also aligning with the growing expectations of investors and stakeholders, particularly in financial hubs like Hong Kong.

There are several benefits of ESG-related financial disclosures. One of the primary benefits is enhanced risk management. By identifying and reporting ESG-related risks, companies can better understand potential vulnerabilities in their operations and supply chains. This proactive approach allows businesses to mitigate risks associated with climate change, social unrest, and governance challenges. For example, companies that disclose their carbon emissions can take steps to reduce their footprint, thereby minimising potential regulatory risks and reputational damage.

Transparency in ESG reporting can also significantly enhance a company's reputation. Consumers and stakeholders are more likely to support businesses that demonstrate a commitment to sustainability and social responsibility. Companies like Unilever and Patagonia have built strong brands around their ESG practices, attracting loyal customers and investors. In Hong Kong, where consumers are becoming increasingly conscious of sustainability, companies that prioritise ESG disclosures can certainly differentiate themselves in a competitive market.

In terms of financial performance, numerous studies have shown a positive correlation between strong ESG performance and financial outcomes. Companies that effectively manage ESG risks and opportunities are often more resilient and better positioned for long-term growth. For businesses in Hong Kong, this means that embracing ESG disclosures can lead to improved financial performance, attracting both local and international investors.

Additionally, as regulatory bodies worldwide continue to tighten their requirements for ESG disclosures, companies that proactively adopt transparent reporting practices will be better positioned to comply with future regulations. In Hong Kong, the Securities and Futures Commission and the Hong Kong Stock Exchange have emphasised the need for enhanced ESG disclosures to align with global standards. By being ahead of the curve, companies can avoid potential penalties while gaining a competitive advantage over less compliant peers.

As the Hong Kong Government has pledged to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050, this commitment underscores the importance of corporate involvement in sustainability efforts. By adopting comprehensive ESG disclosure practices, companies in Hong Kong can contribute to these objectives while simultaneously enhancing their own resilience and competitiveness towards a net-zero future.

The push for financial disclosures, particularly concerning ESG factors, represents a critical evolution in corporate reporting. Enhanced transparency not only benefits individual companies but also contributes to broader societal goals. As the world moves towards a more sustainable future, the importance of effective financial disclosures related to ESG will continue to grow, and companies in Hong Kong should pay close attention to this issue in order to remain competitive and aligned with global standards.

The North Lantau Marine Park (“NLMP”) established on 1 November covers around 2,400 hectares, becoming the eighth and largest marine park in Hong Kong. **Airport Authority Hong Kong** provided key support to the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department during the statutory designation process. The NLMP forms a matrix of interconnected marine protected areas of about 4,570 hectares with Sha Chau and Lung Kwu Chau Marine Park, and the Brothers Marine Park, providing synergistic conservation effects for Chinese White Dolphins and fisheries resources, helping to promote a rebound in the dolphins’ use of waters around Hong Kong International Airport and North Lantau, and benefitting other marine life and fisheries resources.

In support of the Government’s policy of promoting waste-to-energy initiatives, **CLP Power Hong Kong Limited** installed power generation units at the West New Territories Landfill, namely WE Station. The units make use of landfill gas produced locally at the landfill site for power generation and the electricity generated will be transmitted to power grid. With the commissioning of the two new generation units in October 2024, the generation capacity of WE Station has increased to 14 megawatts, making it the largest landfill gas power generation plant in Hong Kong.

China State Construction Engineering (Hong Kong) Limited (“CSHK”) has recently acquired a HK\$500 million social loan, which will support the Kai Tak Light Public Housing Project, highlighting CSHK’s commitment to social responsibility and overall sustainability in Hong Kong. The project aims to provide essential housing for those in need while utilising Modular Integrated Construction technology. This innovative approach shortens construction time by nearly 40% and reduces environmental impact. CSHK has also received the “Outstanding Award for Green and Sustainable Loan Issuer (Architectural and Construction Industry) - Visionary Social Loan Framework” at the HKQAA Hong Kong Green and Sustainable Finance Awards 2024, recognising their achievement in advancing sustainability through financial means as demonstrated in the loan acquisition.



Hang Lung Properties has recently hosted the Real Estate & Decarbonisation Summit. Well attended by academics, policy experts, startups, tenants, and many more, the summit witnessed five panels covering topics such as low carbon construction, energy efficiency, cooling systems, and interior design. It offered a comprehensive overview of the challenges and opportunities in the industry, and showcased innovative solutions and actionable ideas. Another highlight of the event was the results announcement of a startup competition co-hosted with an impact investing firm, where winners were rewarded with industry mentorship to further shape their cutting-edge solutions. With collaboration and innovation, Hang Lung is driving sustainable practices within the real estate industry for a greener, more resilient future.

As the festive season approaches, **Henderson Land** celebrates a green Christmas with its community once again, building on the success of its eco-friendly Christmas tree made from recycled plastic and books. From now until 1 December 2024, the company is launching a recycling initiative across more than 200 of its properties, creating Christmas trees from recycled aluminium cans. In alignment with Carbon Reduction Month in November, Henderson Land partnered with the Environmental Campaign Committee for their Carbon Reduction Action campaign to empower Hong Kong citizens to embark on a collective low-carbon journey.



HK Electric has launched a 52-week Action Planner under its Happy Green Campaign to boost public awareness of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals ("SDGs"). 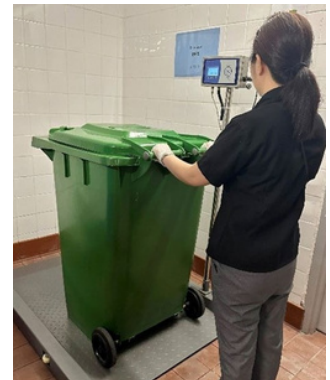

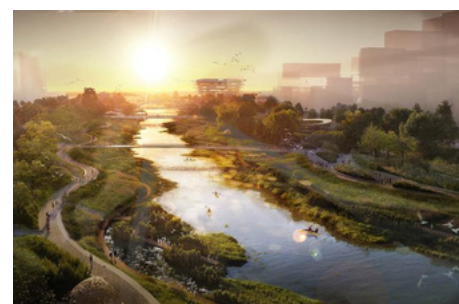

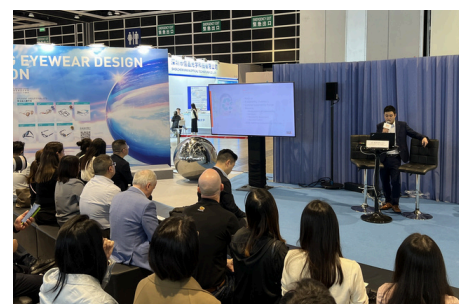

Veolia, fellow BEC Member Sun Hung Kai Properties, and one of China's largest conglomerates broke ground on Hong Kong's first privately funded solar farm on SENT landfill in Tseung Kwan O, supporting the government's Climate Action Plan 2050. Set to operate by the first half of 2025, the facility will feature over 1,800 PV panels across 100,000 square feet, generating 1,200,000 kWh of green electricity annually – enough to power 360 households and reduce carbon emissions by 468 tonnes. The project incorporates innovative engineering for slope stability and landfill protection, and will participate in fellow BEC Member CLP Power's Feed-in Tariff Scheme. As part of ongoing efforts to decarbonise Hong Kong, SENT landfill will also conduct a trial to convert landfill gas into green hydrogen to generate renewable energy.

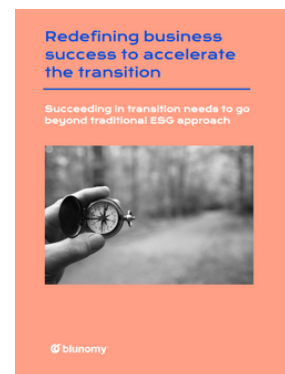

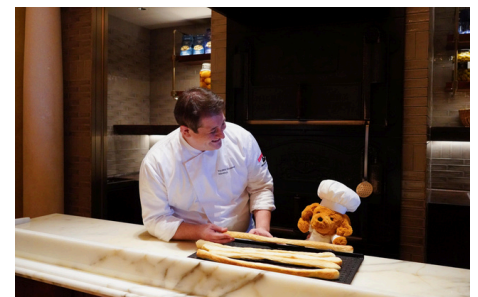
